Innovation and Recognition

Scheduling Committee Made Changes to the Master Schedule

A committee of 10 members (including myself) met in February to begin reviewing and analyzing the master schedule for 2021-2022. By changing some of the subject areas teachers teach, the committee was able to create a 2nd Junior High Math Teacher position. This will now allow all students in Grades 6 - 8 to receive a block of math instruction every day. The two teachers will collaborate and work together to ensure all students receive high quality math instruction.

The committee also made changes to the ELA department. Ms. Molitor and Mr. Laprise will now teach 6th, 7th, and 8th grade ELA. 8th grade students will be able to remain in one building throughout the day (with the exception of 7th and 8th graders utilizing the CTE building - no changes were made in that area). The high school teachers that taught 8th graders will focus on offering more classes to the high school students.
