**Student and Staff Notable Learning** 

4th and 5th Grade Math

The 4th and 5th grade Math classes both learned about fractions. 5th grade focused on adding and subtracting mixed numbers with multiple steps involved. With all of the steps in the calculations, there are a lot of opportunities for errors, but the 5th graders completed problems with minimal errors. IXL (online math practice) has provided the students with time to practice. IXL gives immediate feedback to show students if they successfully completed the practice problems.

The 4th grade focused on finding equivalent fractions. They used fraction strips, they created models by drawing pictures, and they multiplied and divided to find answers. They are working on memorizing multiplication and division facts and they are making the connection that when they know their facts they can solve problems more efficiently and more accurately.
